City Manager/Zoning Administrator's Report

Rich Saladin reported on the following:

- East Todd Water main project will start in July and streets will be closed.
- Chestnut Bridge is on schedule and should be done at the end of June in town and the one outside of town will be in the fall.
- 220th/Patterson Road will be in two sections ½ this year this will be the City's part and ½ next year Richmond Twp. part because of funding issues.
- DWSRF 24' will have 5 projects going out to bid: water main, water wells, water meters, water tower renovation, and lead service replacement.
- Pocket Park review presentation was last Thursday and environmental notices are in the paper and online. Also got notice of an OCCF \$50,000 grant the City will receive for this project.
- M-DOT Grant: The City will apply for and hope to widen Chestnut Street.
- Refresh RC was very productive, and the city looks great, if anyone is interested in taking on a bump out there are some available.
- Ebles is requesting a Zoning change on Mill Street, they are expanding the butcher shop.
- Phelps presentation on rezoning from last month was not approved by the Health Department so the project is not moving forward. RC Youth Sports is in the process of buying this parcel now.
- Intersection at Chestnut and Cathrine there is a crosswalk sign and The City will repaint the lines.
